Mr. Francis explained the situation regarding a scheduled hearing on the above-referenced proposed bond issue Tuesday, 1:30, House Chamber, Legislative Building, Olympia. He asked for opinions from members of the Committee as to whether the IAC should be the coordinating agency in meetings concerning this bond issue.

Following discussion, it was the consensus of those contacted on the Interagency Committee that:

- (1) The IAC be the agency to coordinate the efforts of the proposed bond issue, following it through the legislative process, and
- (2) The IAC also take a strong posture on the Parks and Recreation Commission's portion of the bond issue and support it knowing of the definite need in the areas to be covered through the bond issue, and
- (3) The IAC take no stand as to the method of financing the bond issue, that this is a legislative matter for decision of the Legislature.
