

Changes to the WWRP Lists

The attached tables show the ranked lists of projects for each WWRP category, as approved by the Legislature.

As described in notebook item #4, the legislature changed project funding in several WWRP categories. Specifically, the legislature reduced funding for some projects (in some cases, down to zero), and then moved funds to other projects further down the list. It is our understanding that all but one of the projects that were “zeroed out” should be considered alternate projects, which will remain on the list in their current ranking. The legislature eliminated the Department of Natural Resources project #08-1399, Elk River NRCA Phase 2 (Restoration) 2008, from the State Lands Restoration list.

Through these actions, the legislature either (a) shifted funds from acquisition to development projects to provide a greater economic stimulus or (b) changed the lists to prevent loss of federal matching funds or because project sponsors could no longer provide matching funds. As a result, the lists provide funding for 95 projects, rather than the 87 on the proposed lists.

The RCO plans to take the established approach in distributing returned funds to projects on these lists. First, projects that receive only partial funds will be offered full funding if returned funds are available in that category. If there are sufficient returned funds, then alternates will be funded in the order in which they occur on the list and/or as dictated by specific program policies or statutes.

The final budget included no other provisos that affect distribution of WWRP funds.

Next Steps

If the board approves the list, the RCO director will immediately be authorized to execute project agreements for projects that meet all post-approval requirements, including certification of matching resources.

RESOLUTION #2009-15
WASHINGTON WILDLIFE AND RECREATION PROGRAM
FINAL FUNDING APPROVAL FOR FISCAL YEAR 2010 PROJECTS

WHEREAS, the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board recommended a ranked list of eligible Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program (WWRP) projects to the Governor for inclusion in the 2009-2011 State Capital Budget; and

WHEREAS, Governor Gregoire submitted to the 2009 Legislature all RCO recommended fiscal year 2010 projects for funding consideration; and

WHEREAS, the 2009-2011 Capital Budget includes \$70 million for WWRP; and

WHEREAS, the 2009 Legislature, as part of Engrossed Substitute House Bill 1216 (Capital Budget), approved projects contained in LEAP Capital Document No. 2009-1a; and

WHEREAS, RCW 79A.15.030 (7) authorizes RCO to use up to three percent (3%) of the WWRP appropriation for administration of the program; and

WHEREAS, the projects in the Riparian category provide habitat benefits for a variety of species, thereby supporting the Board's strategy to provide partners with funding to for projects that help sustain Washington's biodiversity; protect "listed" species, and maintain fully functioning ecosystems; and

WHEREAS, the projects in the Farmland Preservation category meet criteria that demonstrate preference for perpetual easements, thus supporting the Board's strategic goal to maximize the useful life of Board-funded projects; and

WHEREAS, the projects in the Habitat Conservation Account (a) address a variety of critical habitat needs, (b) restore existing lands to self-sustaining functionality, (c) protect areas that have retained their natural character and are important in preserving species or features of value, and (d) have been evaluated based on long-term viability, thereby supporting the Board's goals to help agencies maximize the useful life of Board-funded projects and to fund projects that maintain fully functioning ecosystems, sustain Washington's biodiversity, or protect "listed" species and natural settings; and

WHEREAS, the Outdoor Recreation Account projects involve acquisition, development, and/or renovation of properties for recreation, public access on state lands, trails, and access to water, thereby supporting the board's strategy to provide partners with funding to enhance recreation opportunities statewide, including bicycling and walking facilities and facilities most conducive to improved health; and

WHEREAS, the evaluation and approval of these projects occurred in open public meetings, thereby supporting the Board's strategy to ensure that its work is conducted with integrity and in a fair and open manner, and the Board's principles to make strategic investments that are guided by community support and established priorities; and

WHEREAS, funding these projects would further the Board's strategic goal to "[f]und the best projects as determined by the evaluation process";

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board hereby approves the ranked list of WWRP projects contained in *LEAP Capital Document No. 2009-1a* and reflected in Table 1 – *WWRP Ranked List of Projects for Fiscal Year 2010*, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that three percent (3%) of the \$70 million WWRP appropriation be subtracted from the appropriation, to be used for administration of the program, and the remaining \$67.9 million be distributed to the eleven WWRP funding categories according to statutory requirements and RCO policy, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board hereby approves the funding amounts shown in Table 1 – *WWRP Ranked List of Projects for Fiscal Year 2010* and authorizes RCO's Director to execute agreements and implement fiscal year 2010 funding.
